Casa da Baía Setúbal


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One safe destination, an exclusive Portugal.

Did you know that Setúbal is a world to discover and one of the best-kept places in southern Europe? Besides the beaches and the mountains, unique in the country, there is a whole world waiting for you, the perfect motto to get lost among historical nooks and crannies and stunning nature. You won't want to leave us!

Convent and Church of Jesus

The Church of Jesus is considered to be Portugal's first test of a church--hall, designed as a homogeneously illuminated space. The Manueline style building is the work of master Diogo Boitaca, the architect responsible for the construction of the Jerónimos Monastery in Lisbon. The Convent also houses the Setúbal Museum, recently renovated and reopened to the public, making it the cultural and religious ex-LIBRIS of the region.













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Setúbal preserves the identity of its community and that spirit is alive in Troino, one of the city's typical neighbourhoods. Talk to the locals, listen to "charroco", the "official" dialect, and visit one of its most emblematic shops, the "Mercearia Confiança de Troino".

This grocery store, founded in 1926, recovers the curiosities about the history of Setúbal and its inhabitants, showing us the commercial space in its original form.





Fort of São Filipe de Setúbal

Once a defensive and control bastion of the city, it dates back to the reign of King Philip II, and the order to build it was given during the monarch's visit to Setúbal. It was fundamental in defending the coast against pirate attacks from Northern Europe and Africa. Enjoy a drink and a chat with a view over one of the most beautiful bays in the world.



Casa da Baía (Bay House)

The region's tourist promotion centre, in an 18th-century building, houses an exhibition space, cafeteria with a sumptuous indoor terrace and a wonderful outdoor terrace. One of the city's best kept secrets, they say. The space also has a wine cellar and a shop selling regional products. This is also home to the Interpretative Centre of the Sado Estuary Bottlenose Dolphin, "CIRES" a place where you can immerse yourself in the knowledge of this ambassador species of the city.

Casa do Turismo (House of Tourism)

Tourism House, is next to one of the most attractive cultural spaces in the city, the **Culture House**. After a visit to this space, Tourism House is the perfect place to buy a regional wine and learn a little more about the gastronomy and wines of Setúbal.

Finish off with a glass of muscatel and a regional delicacy on the terrace. Enjoy a unique view of the charming Bocage Square and the Town Hall Building



Zivramento Market and the Riverfront

Visiting Setúbal is also getting to know one of the most attractive and genuine markets in the world. It's seeing and feeling the best of the region. Admire a tile panel with more than five thousand pieces. Stock up on the best local products and, of course, the best fish in the country.

Take the opportunity to walk along the riverside area, where you will come across the city's fishermen and harriers.

Fish from the Sado Estuary

And when the mountain air becomes stronger, chase the cuttlefish with the frying pan and get to know the maritime fauna of the Sado Estuary in an incredible mural. It is impossible to leave this place without taking a photo with our fish. Didn't catch the cuttlefish? Go down Avenida Luisa Todi towards the ferry pier and you might find him sitting there, like Fernando Pessoa, inviting you to a reconciliation coffee.

Did you know that 10 minutes from the city there is a place where you can enjoy one of the most beautiful sunsets in the world? And imagine that you can follow this moment in one of the most popular birdwatching locations in Europe. Are you sure you want to leave now?

And because Setubal is a world, in Azeitão, visit the Joana Luísa e Sebastião da Gama House of Memory. If there is poetry that reflects much of our Portugal and especially Arrábida, it was written by this poet. The space reflects much of modern museology and involves everyone who visits it. Read a poem in the company of a "Torta de Azeitão" (egg cream-filled roll) and a very special "Moscatel Roxo" (aged muscatel wine). Take a digestive walk, visiting the region's wineries.

Villages of Azeitão

Wait, don't leave yet... while the poetry, the sweets and the nectars make us think of the return, let us lose ourselves in the streets of the villages of Azeitão. Palaces and farms like the Bacalhôa and the Quinta das Torres, adorn this historical destination with a unique charm. Take along a traditional Azeitão tile, made in the same way since the 16th century. Travel in time.
