










Prof. Zuiz Saldanha Oceanographic Museum

The Oceanographic Museum, installed in the Santa Maria Fortress, is located on the coast between Setúbal and Sesimbra, allowing a very close contact with the marine environment and where you can discover the biodiversity of the Luiz Saldanha Marine Park, a natural heritage unique in the world.

Arrábida Convent

Miradouros (Viewpoints)

Along the road that crosses the mountains, via road N 379 - 1, there are countless viewpoints with breathtaking views that stretch over the Atlantic horizon and the Tróia peninsula on one side, the wonderful villages of Azeitão, the city of Setúbal, the Sado Estuary, the Caparica Fossil Cliff, Lisbon and even, on the best days, the Pena Palace in Sintra on the other.

Albarquel

Albarquel is the closest beach to Setúbal and is accessible by foot along the coastal strip at low tide. It stands out for its versatility and ideal conditions for practising various land and water sports.

Figueirinha

The wide sandy beach, the calm sea, good accessibility and the surrounding beauty of Serra da Arrábida and the Luiz Saldanha Marine Park make Figueirinha one of the best-known bathing areas in the region. It is characterised by a long sandbank that emerges at low tide and through which it is possible to walk and enter the sea. In addition to flaunting the blue flag for 14 years, a sign of national quality for bathing waters, it is also Portugal's Most Inclusive Beach!

Surrounded by the Mediterranean vegetation of Arrábida, Galápos is a narrow strip of sand combined with a calm, blue, transparent sea, separated from Galapinhos beach only by a few rocks.

Galapinhos Beach was voted the most beautiful beach in Europe in 2017. The award was given by European Consumers Choice, through the portal European Best Destinations. A beach sheltered by slopes of Mediterranean vegetation that offers a calm sea and clear waters favouring the observation of marine species.

Voted one of the Seven Natural Wonders of Portugal, this white sand beach with transparent water provides a fantastic contrast to the austerity of the slopes of the Serra da Arrábida. It stands out for the curious Pedra da Anicha, a small rocky islet facing the beach. A beach that offers one of the most beautiful auroras in the


José Maria da Fonseca **House Museum**

An estate and winery at the foot of the Serra da Arrábida, promotes wine aromas in harmony with relaxing moments where the environment and sustainability are privileged. Their own wastewater treatment station and integrated production, a method that involves using exclusively natural products in the development of the precious nectar, also stand out. It also has an accommodation unit and spaces for events.



Quinta das Torres (Torres Winery)

At the gates of Azeitão, this 16th century estate stands out for its imposing turrets and large outdoor patio with one of the most beautiful fountains in the region. Ivv trees cover the walls of the house with a 900m2 lake where the temple-shaped pavilion, whose dome is supported by twelve columns, stands out. It is one of the most popular places for events and on a visit to this idyllic space you will quickly find out why it is so fascinating.
